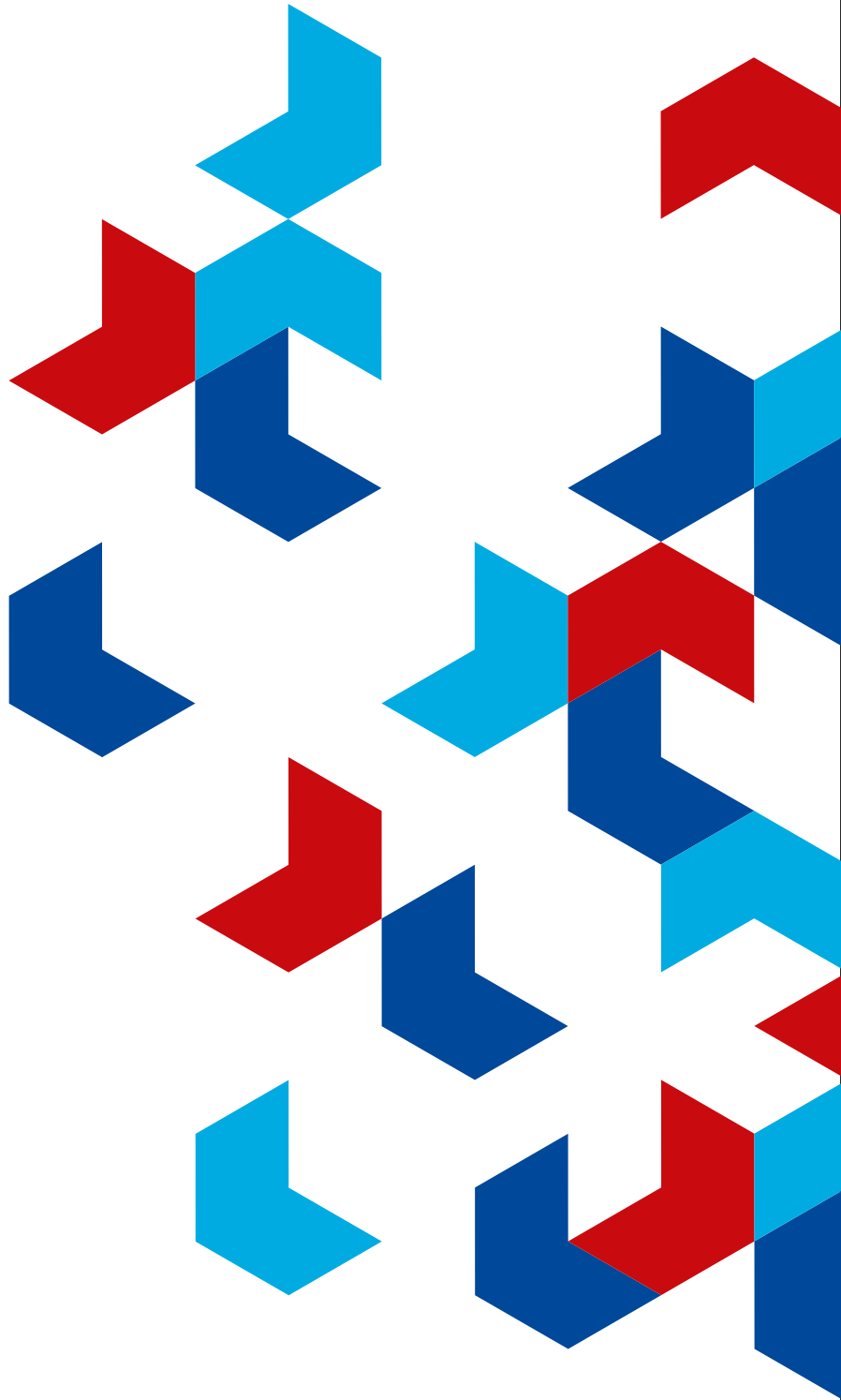
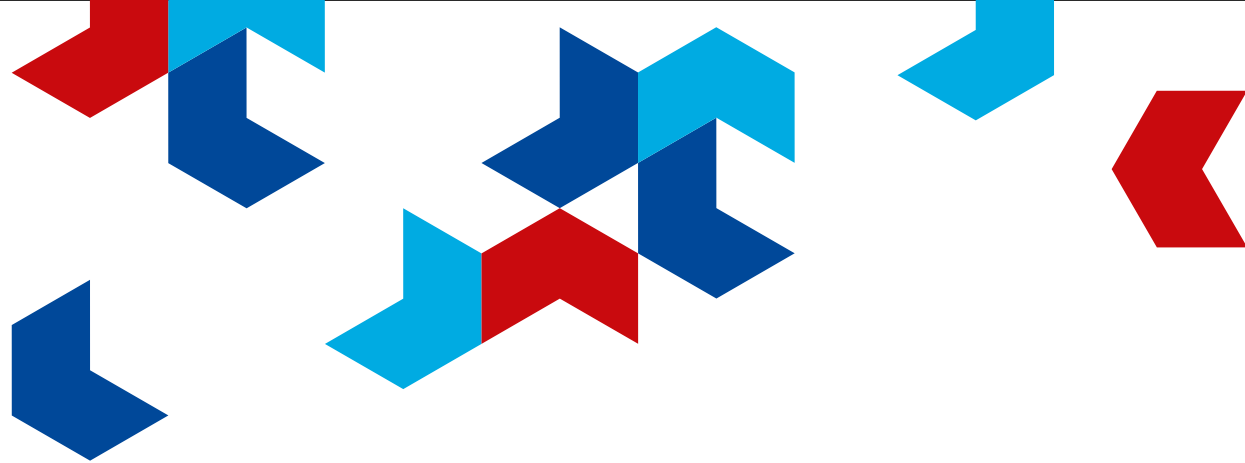

# Treasurer's Report

2022 has financially been a year of uncertainty for the Chamber, given Covid lockdowns, particularly regarding restrictions on holding in-person events and the associated potential impact on events ticket sales and sponsorship income. Despite these unprecedented challenges, I am pleased to report that the Chamber has financially weathered well in 2022 and achieved the following key financial objectives of the Chamber:

- Support the Chamber's Advocacy, Community and Knowledge initiatives.
- Invest in the Chamber's staff and infrastructure.
- Strict cost control.
- Compliance with government regulations and the Chamber's internal policies.
- Overall, be financially viable!

I am pleased to have the opportunity to present to you the financial performance of the Chamber for the year ended 31 December 2022.

## Comments on the 2022 financial performance of the Chamber

Despite 2022 subscription rates maintained at the 2021 level, membership revenue increased by 17% to RMB 3 million. This results from an improved membership base, particularly platinum membership, and the full-year benefit of the 2021 subscription rate increase.

Salaries costs increased by 14% to RMB 2.5 million. This was due to 2022 salary inflation for the Chamber's staff, and unlike 2021, no government social welfare cost exemptions were received in 2022 despite Covid restrictions.

As you can see from the Waterfall Chart below, membership income less payroll costs only leaves the Chamber with RMB 0.5 million to cover all other costs, such as rent and operational expenses!

RMB 1 million was spent on hosting events (excluding notional costs of any in-kind sponsorship such as free use of venues and free beverage supplies), an increase of 17% compared to 2021, offset by event ticket sales of RMB 0.6 million (down 38%

due to Covid), leaving an overall direct net loss on events of RMB 0.4 million to be filled by cash sponsorship.

I want to give a heartfelt thanks to all of the Chambers cash sponsors totalling RMB 1.3 million in 2022, a 79% increase on 2021, RMB 1 million of which was attributable to sponsors of the inaugural ESG China Awards held in October 2022.

The Chamber was successful in 2022 in obtaining a 6-month rent exemption from the Chamber's office landlord due to Covid restrictions, resulting in a 44% reduction in net rental costs. Also, general expenses were down by 15% due to less travel and operational expenses due to Covid restrictions.

From a capital expenditure perspective, in 2022, investments were made in expanding the team's office working space and purchasing new staff chairs, a camera and router, and two new computers.

Overall, the Chamber achieved a FY22 surplus of RMB 0.7 million (FY21: a surplus of RMB 0.2 million), which positions the Chamber well for making new investments in the first half of FY23, particularly focused on resources and initiatives to further serve the Chamber's members.

As well as thanking the Chamber's members for their support through membership subscriptions and contributions to events, I would like to thank the Chamber team for their dedication and hard work to achieve these results in such a challenging time. A special thank you goes to Caroline Wang, the Chamber's Finance Controller, for her professionalism and tirelessness in managing the Chamber's finances and compliance matters, as well as for putting up with me!

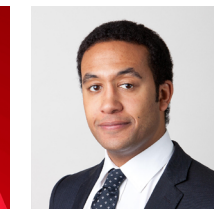

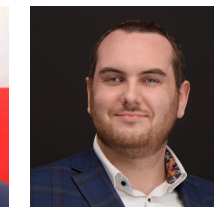

# Message from the British Consul-General Shanghai

I am delighted to contribute to this first edition of the Chamber's Annual Review, looking back on what has been an extraordinary year – a very tough year – for the city, its residents and businesses.

Despite all the challenges of Covid since 2020, none of us could have expected the Shanghai lockdown last spring. It was very tough for everyone who went through that time – businesses, schools, individuals – and I am sure that many of us are still feeling the consequences. At that time, despite being locked down ourselves, we prioritised support for the most vulnerable British nationals who faced medical and other needs, who were concerned about child separation, or who wanted to leave.

A year of uncertainty culminated with unexpected and rapid changes to China's Covid policies, in turn bringing with it new challenges. The relaxation of domestic controls and easing of travel is very welcome. For our bilateral relations, as also for business, civic and academic links, the major downside of the last 3 years was the lack of in-person, high-level contact. For the Consulate, as for international businesses too, our role in explaining China to our UK headquarters has never been more important. Online contacts have been great, but the lack of personal contact, of conversations over dinner or away from the formalities, have been a real drag on relations.

So it is welcome that Chinese leaders are now starting to travel again, including Vice-President Wang Qishan attending the funeral of Her Late Majesty The Queen (and having positive discussions with senior Ministers), and then Foreign Minister Wang Yi and Foreign Secretary James Cleverly meeting at the UN General Assembly in

New York and a few days ago in Munich. I very much hope that we will soon see the resumption of British Ministerial visits to China.

In late November, Prime Minister Sunak gave a major foreign policy speech. On China he talked of a policy of "robust pragmatism", recognising that we cannot ignore China's significance in world affairs, its role in maintaining global economic stability, and in tackling climate change. But we also recognise that there are areas of disagreement and systemic challenges to our values and interests, which is why we need effective diplomacy and engagement, to improve our own resilience and in particular economic security.

That was very much her approach when the British Ambassador called on Shanghai Mayor Gong Zheng in December, discussing the many ties which bind us, the important areas on which we collaborate and want to do more, and the role of Shanghai as the headquarters for the majority of British businesses operating in China. Despite the challenges of the last three years, British businesses continue to grow and invest in China, including in world-class R&D and state-of-the-art facilities. I hope we can also look to the support of Shanghai's new Party Secretary Chen Jining, who is a UK alumnus who studied and conducted research in the UK for ten years.

As the opportunities for in-person travel reopen, we will need to rebuild and

reinvigorate the business, academic, cultural and civic links between Shanghai and the UK. But we can also celebrate successes over the last year, despite all the difficulties, including an agreement between the Royal College of Art and Donghua University to establish a Sino-British Arts Institution in Shanghai, the second highly successful exhibition from the Tate Museums at the Museum of Art Pudong (with more to come in future) and the National Gallery exhibition at the Shanghai Museum.

The Year of the Rabbit is a year of hope; and the Rabbit signifies longevity, peace and prosperity. Let us hope that 2023 brings peace and prosperity for us all.

As we look ahead, let me thank the British Chamber's Executive Committee and all the Chamber staff for delivering an amazing programme of events and activities through the year, despite all the odds, and for continuing to support and promote British business in China. We look forward to further collaboration in 2023!

### Advocacy in Review

**ADVOCACY** is one of the three central pillars of the Chamber's offering to its members. Over the past three years, we have been working tirelessly to develop this offering by continuing to expand and enhance existing relationships with the relevant stakeholders. Now we are seeing the fruits of our labour.

The Chamber has been a valuable partner in Shanghai's (and China's) efforts to promote policies that benefit our members and the wider business community. In 2022, the COVID-19 pandemic significantly impacted our local economy, and the loosening of public health restrictions still affects many businesses. The Chamber has been dedicated to helping businesses address our community's various pandemic-related challenges. We provide rapid policy updates for our members on the ever-changing operational restrictions and government resources available, underscoring the importance of our work.

Throughout the past year, the Chamber has worked to improve government responses to the pandemic through consultations and formal submissions. The Chamber's advocacy efforts reflect the priorities of our membership and the business community. The input of volunteers on our Policy Team helps shape the implementation strategy of Chamber staff in their day-to-day dealings with governments and the wider business community network in China.

The start of 2022 saw one of the strengths of the British Chambers in China, with the coming together of all four chambers to survey and compile views of British businesses across the Chinese mainland for our fourth position paper. Our Shanghai and East China members contributed hugely to this paper, completing our questionnaires and joining industry-focused roundtables – an effort for which we are tremendously grateful. Members' feedback created an excellent paper that not only helped the UK business community to understand the issues that industry peers face in-country but also provided authoritative data points, and conclusions that could be presented to select government leaders at a national level, including the UK Consulate and Embassy sector leads in Shanghai and Beijing, the Chinese Ambassador to the UK, Zheng Zeguang, and Lord Grimstone, the Minister for Investment at the Department for International Trade.

Seeking to provide constructive opinions and recommendations from UK businesses on access reform, capital flows, cybersecurity and other critical issues for operating in this market, the Position Paper also opened doors for our Advocacy team to further press home essential issues of formal consultations with some of the most influential Chinese ministries dictating the local legal and regulatory landscape for members – the Central Ministry of Commerce and their counterparts at the Shanghai Municipal Commission of Commerce and Invest Shanghai, part of the Shanghai Foreign Investment Development Board.

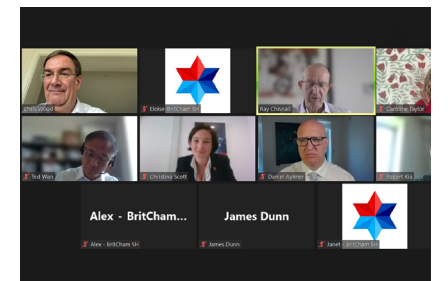

### Knowledge in Review

Our **KNOWLEDGE** pillar continues to be at the very forefront of the Chambers' work in 2022. We have hosted more than 40 knowledge events including 10 training sessions. Over 140 leading c-suite executives, industry experts, KOLs, opinion formers and government decision-makers spoke at these events and shared valuable insights.

We have welcomed more than 1,500 participants over the year, ranging from events such as C-Suite roundtables, business briefings, seminars, webinars, training and workshops. These activities are critical for members and the wider business community to help their businesses navigate the China market.

Two new initiatives have been introduced in 2022 were Creative Industries & Marketing Directory and Best Emerging Talent Festival, both driven by the Chamber's Creative Industries and Marketing Committee.

Creative Industries & Marketing Directory is a comprehensive list of international creative firms operating in China. Updated quarterly, this is a powerful tool for companies and Chamber networks to connect the best international talent available. Now comprises 136 of the best international firms from all over China, the Directory is published in English and Chinese and details the services and contact information for each firm.

The Best Emerging Talent (BET) Festival is a celebration of emerging talent from the UK's best Design and Advertising degree courses. The Festival aims to introduce fresh talent to international creative agencies and corporations in China and offer more exposure to UK Universities.

The 1st BET Festival has showcased over 140 graduate portfolios, hand-picked by a jury of industry experts. In addition, a half-day webinar was also part of the Festival, featuring a packed agenda of talks and panels with inspiring creative educators from the UK, and industry creative entrepreneurs in China.
