

# **Treasurer's Report**



I am pleased to report that the Chamber has financially performed well in 2023 against budget, largely due to the continuing support of our members and sponsors, the Executive Committee and nine Sector Committees, the performance of our Chamber's staff, as well as tight cost control. The following key financial objectives of the Chamber have been achieved in 2023:

- Financially support the Chamber's Advocacy, Community and Knowledge initiatives:
- Invest in the Chamber's resources (staff and technology);
- Implement tight cost control;
- Be compliant with government regulations and the Chamber policies; and
- Overall, be financially viable.

#### Overview of the 2023 financial performance of the Chamber



Overall income for 2023 is RMB 4.9 million, which includes membership subscriptions, event ticket income and event cash sponsorship, and is flat compared to 2022.

I am delighted to have the opportunity to present to you the financial performance of the Chamber for the year ended 31 December 2023.

Overall operating costs and events costs rose by +16% to RMB 4.9 million, matching income. This overall results in a small net loss of RMB 1,800 (versus a budgeted loss of RMB 179K and 2022 net surplus of RMB

#### i) Deeper dive - Membership Income and **Operating Costs**



Membership income increased by 6%. Given membership subscription rates have been maintained at 2022 and 2021 levels, the membership revenue increase results from increased membership numbers, particularly the number of platinum members.

Salaries costs increased by 9% to RMB 2.5 million. This is due to 2023 salary inflation and staff changes.


Rent increased by 65% to RMB 0.5 million, due to a 6-month Covid rent exemption the Chamber obtained from our SOE landlord last year, and 2023 rent increase.

Overall, you can see that total 2023 membership income fell short of covering operating costs by RMB 342K. This however compares favourably to a budgeted deficit of RMB 878K, a favorable difference of RMB B536K.

#### ii) Deeper Dive - Events and Sponsorship

RMB 1.4 million was spent on hosting events (this excludes the notional cost of in-kind sponsorship such as free venues and beverages), an increase of 35% compared to

2022 but close to the 2023 budget. This is due to an increase in in-person events.



Event ticket income was up 20%, but cash sponsorship was down by 25%, largely due to the one-off RMB 1 million cash sponsorship received in 2022 for the 2022 ESG China Awards.

This results in an overall 2023 direct surplus on events of RMB 340K, versus 2022 event surplus of RMB 911K. In considering the events surplus's above, please bear in mind that the event costs above do not include apportioned salary costs of our Chamber's staff working on such events, which if allocated to events, would reduce the surplus's reported.

#### Conclusion

In conclusion for 2023, our Chamber has financially performed well and is financially viable. This positions the Chamber well for focusing in 2024 on resources and new initiatives to further serve our members.

I would like to give a heartfelt thanks to all of the Chamber's members for their continuing support through membership subscriptions and their contributions to events. I wish finally to specifically thank Ms. Yalu Gan our new Financial Controller who joined us mid-year and her predecessor Ms. Caroline Wang, both of whom have made a great contribution in managing the Chamber's finances and delivering these results.

# Message from the British Consul-General Shanghai

During 2023 my colleagues in the British Consulate-General worked actively with the Chamber team to support UK business in China; I am keen to develop this further and through my role on the Chamber's Executive Committee encourage members to stay connected to the wider British Consulate teams.

It has, for me personally, been a wonderful few months and I have been delighted to meet so many members of the Chamber in a relatively short time. During my interactions I have been impressed not only by the Executive Committee's commitment to driving forward positive change and innovative programmes on behalf of members, but also by the vibrancy I have felt amongst members, themselves. Myriad challenges have been presented to you all - businesses, schools and individuals over the past few years and I am delighted to be working with you now that things have turned a corner; the energy and commitment you display inspires me to work as hard as I can on behalf of both the UK/China relationship and British businesses in China.

We saw a positive trajectory of engagement over 2023, post zero-Covid, with the resumption of face-to-face ministerial engagement. Key highlights were the visit of the former Foreign Secretary in August and Ministry of Science and Technology Vice-Minister Wu's attendance at the Al Safety Summit in the UK in November. We look forward to building on this trajectory throughout 2024.

I am grateful to the Executive Committee for inviting me to contribute to this year's Annual Review. I took up the post of His Majesty's Consul-General following my predecessor's, Chris Wood's, departure, in September 2023; I would like to recognise the role that Chris, himself, played in maintaining strong business, people and government ties during an extremely difficult period.

I am pleased, too, that we are now beginning to see more high level UK foot-fall to the East China region; in my first few months I have received the Lord Mayor of the City of London as well as former Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, Thérèse Coffey. During Ms Coffey's visit we met around 100 British companies at Food & Hospitality China (FHC), and the CIIE. During those trade events I was reminded of the importance of face-to-face engagement. It is this that builds trust and, in turn, drives prosperity and I would like to encourage more of it in the coming year. This is why I was so pleased to attend the contract signing ceremony of the Chamber's new Zhejiang office together with His Majesty's Ambassador to China, Dame Caroline Wilson. I very much support the Chamber in its desire to engage more with businesses in East China. Hangzhou is, like much of the region, a vibrant city and I am confident that this initiative will present an array of opportunities to British and Chinese businesses, alike.

It is important for us to develop more safe engagement with China. Total trade in goods and services between the UK and mainland China in the four quarters to the end of Q2 2023 was £109 billion, an increase of 9% or £9bn year-on-year. Total UK exports to China amounted to £41bn, an increase of 40% or £12bn year-on-year. And our education, cultural and people ties are as deep in Shanghai as anywhere in China. This is why the UK government has adopted a policy of robust pragmatism in

our bilateral relationship; we cannot ignore China's significance in world affairs, its role in maintaining global economic stability, and in tackling climate change. A stable, prosperous China is good for Britain and for the world. And this is why we need effective engagement and diplomacy. But engagement is not always easy and the challenges to business brought about by macro-economic and geo-political factors are significant. I would like to thank you, then, for all you do to create opportunities for people in China and the UK and for the role that you play in creating a better life for millions of people through the creation of jobs, wealth and a more secure, healthier and greener environment for us all.

## **Advocacy in Review**

**ADVOCACY** continues to be a fundamental pillar of the services the British Chamber of Commerce Shanghai provides to its members. Having worked hard over the past few years to enhance and broaden our relationships with relevant stakeholders, our efforts are now producing notable requite.

The Chamber has been an invaluable ally in Shanghai's, and by extension China's, endeavours to advocate for policies that benefit our members and the broader business community. In 2023, as businesses dealt with the ongoing repercussions of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Chamber was committed to helping them navigate the various challenges. We kept our members up-to-date with the continually changing operational restrictions and available government resources, which underscored the importance of our work. Throughout 2023, the Chamber made concerted efforts to improve government responses through meetings and consultations. Our advocacy work reflects the priorities of our members and the larger business community.

One key initiative in 2023 was a roundtable series in which the Chamber worked together with **the China-Britain Business Council** and the **UK Department of Business & Trade (DBT)** on topics including state-owned enterprise competition and market distortion, the revisions to the anti-espionage law, IP protection, and post-covid recovery, etc. The series aimed to gather and convey UK business voices to the UK government to guide and influence opinion and decision-making on each topic.

Chamber members also met **high-level delegates** from the UK in meetings and events, including the Minister of State from the Department for Business and Trade, the British Trade Commissioner for China, the Deputy Director of Export Support Service at DBT, and the British Council CEO.

BritCham Shanghai similarly engaged in comprehensive discussions with Chinese stakeholders such as the **Shanghai Municipal Commission of Commerce**, **Shanghai Foreign Investment Development Board (Invest Shanghai)**, **Shanghai International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission**, and various district governments. These dialogues aimed to enhance understanding of Shanghai's business environment and aid UK businesses in navigating the local market. These activities further solidified UK-China relationships and demonstrated BritCham Shanghai's dedication to promoting cross-border trade and business growth.

In addition, the Chamber attended several key fairs and conferences in 2023, such as the **UK-China Fintech Conference**, **Erhai Forum**, and **the China International Import Expo**, joining meaningful discussions with key stakeholders. These efforts demonstrate BritCham Shanghai's commitment to fostering dialogue and promoting collaboration between the UK and China.

Recognising the importance of regional engagement, the Chamber is also working on its outreach into East China by launching a new Zhejiang initiative to drive mutual economic and business growth and enhance trade ties between the UK and this important economic region. The initiative includes the launch of a **new Zhejiang office** in Hangzhou. This will be a significant milestone in the Chamber's development and forms part of a broader strategy that the Chamber is excited to execute in 2024. Its key focuses will be building a platform for Sino-British exchanges, creating a hub for the UK community in Zhejiang, supporting local Chinese enterprises in partnering with British businesses and expanding their global footprints through a pilot associate membership programme, and promoting international education and exchange programmes in collaboration with our friends at the British Council.



# **ESG & Sustainability**




